just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.” (Matthew 25:34-40)

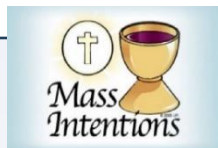
We invite you to pray the following prayer every hour, for 12 hours, on May 9th.
